Major Elective Courses (12 hours)

3000-level or above course in CLAS, GREK, or LATN; OR, 3000-level or above course in ANTH, ARHI, CMLT, HIST, LING, PHIL, RELI that has a significant component dealing with the ancient Greco-Roman world and is approved by the Classics Department; OR 1000/2000-level course in GREK (up to 6 hours)

Note that most 3000-level courses have lower-division prerequisites; for example, ARHI 2300, LING 2100, and PHIL 1000, Area IV, are prerequisites to the 3000-level courses approved under major electives. If you have not already fulfilled the two-course A&S Fine Arts/ Philosophy/ Religion requirement, you can fulfill this requirement by taking two 3000-level or above courses from the ARHI, PHIL, RELI courses approved by the Classics Department.
