



UGA Franklin College-University of Liverpool Doctoral Student Short-Term International Research Fellowship

The week-long <u>Franklin College-University of Liverpool Doctoral Short-Term International Research Fellowship</u>, or "Franklin-Liverpool Fellowship," is open to Ph.D. students in good standing in any discipline in the College. Preference will be given to applicants who have advanced to candidacy, doctoral students at any level are encouraged to apply.

Through this Fellowship program, up to five (5) students will be selected. While students will travel as a group, they will work with faculty in different departments to conduct research and develop an international network of research contacts. This year's cohort of Fellows is scheduled to be in Liverpool during the business week of May 11-15, 2020.

Expenses Covered

The Franklin College will reserve and pay for international airfare between Atlanta and Liverpool. The University of Liverpool will provide overnight accommodation for the one-week duration of the stay. Fellows are responsible for reserving and paying for ground transportation between Athens and the Atlanta airport, and between Liverpool and the Manchester airport. *Meals are not covered by this program*.

Liverpool Faculty Mentor and UGA Approval

Students applying will need to have obtained the written endorsement of a faculty mentor at the University of Liverpool (https://www.liverpool.ac.uk/a-z/academic/), indicating that the faculty member is willing to serve as a mentor for the time of the student's week-long visit.

Approval for the scheduled week-long visit must be obtained from both the student's major professor and the respective UGA department head. A UGA department may put forward up to two applications for this Fellowship each year.

Activities at Liverpool

While at Liverpool, students are expected to

- conduct research in consultation with the selected faculty mentor;
- offer a public lecture (or equivalent presentation) about their research;
- meet with faculty and graduate students to discuss longer-term research collaborations.

- 1-2 page description of the research project to be pursued at the University of Liverpool;
- Preliminary title of presentation and description of presentation format;
- A current curriculum vitae.

Applications will be reviewed by the Franklin International Studies Committee, which is chaired by Associate Dean Martin Kagel. Students will be notified of this decision in early December.
