

Hugh Hodgson School of Music

Full-Time Assistant Professor of Music Theory – Tenure Track

The Hugh Hodgson School of Music at the University of Georgia (UGA) invites applications and nominations for the position of assistant professor of music theory, tenure-track. Applicants meeting the minimum requirements are encouraged to apply. Anticipated start date is Aug. 1, 2019.

Responsibilities

- Teach music theory at the undergraduate through graduate levels. Teaching load is normally five courses per year and includes supervision of graduate teaching assistants.
- Conduct research and creative activity in the field of music theory.
- Participate in activities related to the academic mission of the university, including service on committees, student advising, student recruiting, and administration of area assessments.
- Other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- An earned doctorate in Music Theory or be ABD with a terminal degree transcript on file no later than nine months from appointment date.
- At least one academic year of college-level teaching experience in music theory.

Preferred Qualifications

- Applicants whose scholarly expertise broadens the current research profile of the composition/theory area—including those who work with commercial, vernacular, or non-Western musics—are especially encouraged to apply.
- Ability to work collaboratively and effectively with students and faculty.
- Interest in contributing to other academic or performance-based areas of the school.
- A desire to contribute to a dynamic, holistic music program located in a city known for its music and arts culture.
