Within Health Psychology the research area is open. Successful candidates will be expected to have an established and current record of extramural funding, experience working with biomarkers or other clearly operationalized markers of health behaviors and outcomes, and be prepared to contribute to training in advanced quantitative methodologies relevant to health psychology (e.g., innovative statistical, experimental, or data collection methods).

Candidates will be expected to contribute to the teaching needs of the department at the graduate and undergraduate level, particularly in health psychology. Program affiliation within the department is open. Candidates may affiliate with one or more of our department's core training areas: Behavioral and Brain Sciences, Industrial/Organization Psychology, and Clinical Psychology. Candidates should expect to come in to the department appointed as a full professor, must have been tenured at a prior institution, and must bring a demonstrably national reputation to the institution.
