**Dean Anna Stenport's Remarks:**

Michael Hill has been appointed as Executive Director of the Franklin College IT; thanks to Ted Gragson for his service as chair of that committee.

Two Associate Dean searches are in progress, Associate Dean Tom Mote will be stepping down on October 31.

As presented at last month's Senate meeting, the Dean's Faculty Advisory Committee is in the process of being formed. Invitations to serve have been sent out via email. It is expected that the committee will hold its inaugural meeting in January of 2024.

Campus-wide programming around multidisciplinary Data Science and Artificial Intelligence is being planned for academic year 2023-24. The Institute for Artificial Intelligence along with the Provost's Office are leading the planning through a committee with several Franklin faculty represented.

The Franklin College has formed an exploratory curriculum committee around potential academic planning in Data Science + X (another discipline). This committee is chaired by Paula Lemons with representation from several departments.

The University's "40 under 40" event will be held Friday September 22. 13 of this year's award recipients were Franklin graduates.

### **New Business:**

Proposal to change the name of the Department of Geography - Presented by Hilda Kurtz, Professor and Department Head of Geography –

Dr. Kurtz begins by explaining the process of changing the name of a department, highlighting the many steps in the process. She states that this proposal is in line with a growing number of

peer and aspirational departments in the US and abroad who are also changing their department's names for a variety of reasons. The UGA department requested the name "Department of Geography, Society, and Environment as this captures the full breadth of what UGA Geography faculty and students study and teach.

Voting: After discussion, the motion does not pass - 12 yes, 14 no, 8 abstentions

Presentation by Matthew Boedy, Conference President, Georgia AAUP, about the results of the "Faculty in the South" survey – results summary and slideshow

While there were many questions on this survey, the Georgia AAUP was interested in following up on a previous survey about the effects of censure from the AAUP on the USG due to its changes to tenure and the post tenure review process, in addition to learning what other issues faculty were concerned about. Dr. Boedy concluded by imploring faculty to advocate for themselves to lawmakers, to the USG, and to the Board of Regents through shared governance institutions like this one or other avenues to help remove the USG from the AAUP's censure list.
