

LECTURER. The Department of Sociology at the University of Georgia invites applications for a non-tenure track Lecturer position to begin fall semester 2022. The selected applicant will teach sociology courses to support the Criminal Justice Studies Program, an undergraduate interdisciplinary degree program (<https://cjstudies.uga.edu/>). We seek a candidate who shows a commitment to excellence in teaching with a demonstrated ability to teach substantive, methodological, and internship courses such as Criminology, Juvenile Delinquency, Criminal Punishment and Society, Research Methods in Criminal Justice, Communities and Crime, and the Criminal Justice Internship. This is a full-time teaching position with a course load of four courses each semester.

Candidates must have completed all degree requirements for a Ph.D. in Sociology, Criminology, or Criminal Justice before the start of the first semester of teaching. A J.D. is not considered a terminal degree for this position.

Lecturers are eligible to participate in professional-development opportunities, such as the Service-Learning Fellows Program (<https://servicelearning.uga.edu/service-learning-fellows-program>), and receive funds for professional travel when they are available. Although the desire on the part of the Department of Sociology is to have a long-term relationship with the chosen applicant, reappointment occurs annually. The university has a promotion path for lecturers (for details see <https://provost.uga.edu/policies/appointment-promotion-and-tenure/guidelines-for-appointment-and-promotion-of-lecturers/>).

Applications received by January 10, 2022 will receive full consideration. Review of files will continue until the position is filled.
