The Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish (A.B) with an Area of Emphasis in Interdisciplinary Studies offers students the opportunity to integrate their Spanish proficiency in language, culture, linguistics, and/or literature with other areas of interest, or another major, by combining Spanish courses and related courses focused on international, cultural, or linguistic matters.
